# Camp Dogwood Fall 2013

## Schedule and Activity, Speaker & Presentation Reference Page

Inside this page is your weekend Camp Dogwood Schedule and Camper Packet. Have a great weekend! You may attend as many or as few of our activites as you wish. Just make sure not to over-do it! And always allow your dog (and yourself) to rest & cool down between activities.

• AGILITY LEVELS & QUALIFICATIONS Levels are based on the member of the team (human or dog) that is LEAST skilled.

**LEVEL 1:** New - Never been on agility equipment before; or very limited experience; or extreme flight risk; or scared of multiple obstacles. (Lack of weave pole/teeter proficiency not included) Focus on equipment and lead hands and exercises for focus, attention & handling skills.

**LEVEL 2:** Some experience on all of the equipment (at low or moderate height). Sequencing short sequences. Has only done agility at camp, attended at least one camp previously, and/or has some training outside of class. Intro to crosses (front & rear).

LEVEL 3: Comfortable on all equipment at full height (teeter excluded, & weaves poles mostly straight up but can be open). Sequences up to 10 obstacles. Working knowledge of crosses (front & rear). Regularly trains in agility or has successfully completed many camps/agility training with this dog. Review/improve crosses (front & rear).

LEVEL 4: Competition or equivalent. Works equipment full height, teeter & weaves, too. Sequences 16+ obstacles. Trains agility regularly.

• FLYBALL Beginner: No experience or learning basics. **Intermediate:** Must have any experience in flyballl...Can include sessions at camp.

• FRISBEE Beginner: Learn basics of "finally" throwing the Frisbee properly & getting your dog to catch it. Many are naturals!

**Intermediate/Freestyle:** For dogs adept at catching a Frisbee, this session will help develop beginning 'freestyle moves' like overs, flips, & vaulting.

• Kq NOSE WORK LEVEL 1: Inspired by working detection dogs, K9 Nose Work is the fun search and scenting activity for virtually all dogs and people. This easy to learn activity and sport builds confidence and focus in many dogs, and provides a safe way to keep dogs fit and healthy through mental and physical exercise. This workshop will introduce you and your pooch from the beginning to Nose Work.

LEVEL 2: This one is for dogs who have been introduced to nose work and are working more

complex hides. Dog can still be on food / odor.

- **LURE COURSING** For the safety and well-being of the dog, lure can be run at many levels...depending on experience, age and conditioning. Please let the fantastic Pat & Jim know your dog's health so speed & appropriate suggestions can be made.
- TRACKING Teaching your dog to follow the scent trail or disturbed vegetation scent, left by a person (or other animal) that has traveled along a certain route. Dogs can be taught to footstep track (very precision oriented tracking style), trail (the dog still follows the scent left on the ground, but with less precision than footstep tracking), or air scent (use the scent in the air to determine in which direction the person/prey went). Dogs should be hungry when learning how to track!
- TREIIBALL Treilball is a new sport imported from Europe where dogs use herding skills to drive exercise balls into a pen. In this activity you will be introduced to herding commands to train your dog to move left and right and to push the balls toward the pen. Your dog will use it's nose or shoulder to drive the balls. Any dog who loves to chase, retrieve or herd will enjoy this sport.

#### ASK DR. JANE / ASK THE VET

This is an open forum session where you can informally ask our camp vet, Dr. Jane questions regarding canine health. In addition, these sessions can be used as a time for round table discussion about such topics as managing arthritis, use of supplements, vaccinations, allergies, etc...let Dr. Jane know what you would like to talk about.

#### BARN HUNT

Barn Hunt is a new sport that has dogs begging to participate. It allows any breed of dog to tap into their natural hunting instincts. In a trial, the dogs would search a barn-like area for a rat safely enclosed in a vented PVC tube. The dog and handler must have a partnership so the handler can call alert when the dog has found the correct tube hidden among the hay/straw bales. Barn Hunt is a family friendly sport where the treatment of the dogs and the rats are taken seriously. In this class, your dog will be introduced to the sight and smell of the rats. You will learn the basics of the sport of Barn Hunt. Handlers do not handle the rats. You will just praise and reward your dog for whatever she does naturally when encountering the rats. Once the drive is there, we progress to multiple tubes with the dog needing to indicate which tube contains the rat and/or hiding the tubes. Any breed/size/age of dog can participate. Our rats' safety is always considered.

Rats are not to be harmed durning Barn Hunt.

#### BUILDING CONFIDENCE IN YOUR SHY DOG

This class will cover why some dogs are shy, nature (genetics) vs nurture (early socialization). Canine body language (what does a shy dog look like) will be reviewed. Strategies for helping a shy dog will be provided - examples are how to change your dog's feelings about "scary" things, teaching skills to build confidence, and alt-remedies like body wraps, DAP, and rescue remedy.

#### CANINE CORE CONDITIONING:

In this class you will learn how to safely exercise your dog to improve core strength, coordination, flexibility, balance, and proprioception. These exercises are important for conditioning your dog for various dog sports, preventing injuries and aging gracefully. These exercises are also great for building your dog's confidence. You will get plenty of time to try various pieces of equipment such as: cavaletti poles; exercise ball, egg, and peanut; wobble board; rocker board; and tilt board. Bring lots of small treats & get ready to have fun with your dog!

#### CANINE GOOD CITIZEN (CGC) PREP / TEST

The CGC Prep session is designed to prepare those of you who are interested in taking the CGC test at camp or at some point in the future. The CGC Prep session is also a great way to "brush-up" on basic obedience skills even if you do not plan on taking the test. The fee to take a CGC Certification Test at camp is \$10. You may also arrange an alternative testing time if you have a conflict during the CGC Testing time on camp schedule. See Wendy or Dennis to arrange an alternate time.

#### CARTING

Catch Jim from Lure Coursing anytime between open lure times and arrange a mini-cartingsession on the spot....or attend his informal Demo and Carting Intro session after lunch on Sunday at the Lure Course field.

#### CONTINUED FROM THE FRONT (BOTTOM)

#### COACHING A ORANGE BANDANNA DOG TO SUCCESS

Camp Dogwood has the orange bandanna policy to protect dogs that don't know how to cope with other dogs or people coming into their personal space. For some dogs, their "personal space" even includes any room or yard that they are in. These are not "bad" dogs. They are simply "reactive" dogs. Session was created to help owners of reactive dogs understand why dogs do what they do, how to protect them from situations that they are not able to succeed in, and to teach simple exercises that will make you and your dog more comfortable & make camp more enjoyable for you and your four-legged family member.

#### COMPANION ANIMALS AS SPIRITUAL GUIDES

Many of us know that our dogs are wonderful friends and companions to us. Kind of humous that DOG is GOD spelled backwards. Dogs have a special way about them as they are adaptive to our environment and lifestyle. So much so that many of us think of them as little humans. In this open discussion session, we will share ways our animals have been our angels and guides. We will also discuss more subtle ways they have influenced our evolution and how we can honor their guidance in a more appropriate way.

#### DAYPASS CAMPER PUP-ARAZZI

Renny our camp photographer extraordinaire does her best to get photos of as many campers as possible each day. It can be tough to be make sure she captures a special moment for day pass campers, since your time at camp is short. Day Pass campers are invited to come down and have a brief photo op with Renny. These photos will be processed and back to camp by 5:00 each day.

#### DECODING YOUR DOG: A TALK BY STEVE DALE

Our dogs are constantly communicating with us, even looking to us for answers (poor dogs). Steve will talk about how to "read" dogs. And also how to have a conversation without saying a word. Steve Dale (certified animal behavior consultant) is an editor of "Decoding Your Dog," authored by the American College of Veterinary Behaviorists, due out early January.

#### DOGA

Based on the "Barking Buddha" by Brenda Bryan, yogis will follow a traditional Hatha yoga practice with their dog as a partner. Doga will help to connect and unify the dogi and yogi. Please bring a yoga mat if you have one! No Doga (or yoga) experience is required for this.

#### DOG MASSAGE

These sessions are hands-on and focus on a variety of massage techniques to use on your dog. Massage for Canine Athletics will focus on pre & post massage techniques for dogs before they participate in such activities as lure coursing, flyball, agility, or Frisbee. Massage for relaxation will focus on techniques to calm and promote relaxation. The "Techniques" session covers a range of applications for massage.

#### FREESTYLE DANCE

Try this hot new sport that is everyone is talking about! If you like to teach your dog new things, come to this class and have some fun. Learn to teach your dog to do under, zig-zag, loop, pole, circle, gee, haw and take a bow. In the intermediate class we will be doing more advanced moves. At the end of the class we will put it all together with music. A reward-based class so be sure to bring a lot of soft tasty treats for your dog!

#### **GET FOCUSED!**

Does your dog get distracted easily? Jump on your visitors? Or get over-excited when they see their friends? In this class you will learn some fun & creative methods to help your dog to "Get Focused!" Learn how to improve a dog's impulse control, improve focus on you and to relax on cue. You will also learn response substitution (redirection) to prevent a dog from getting into trouble. Don't expect a lot of hard work in this class because you both will have fun! You need to focus on your dog, so it is suggested to bring only 1 dog to this class.

#### **GROOMING SECRETS**

In this session, Tammie will share her grooming knowledge and help you with home grooming care of your pet, including bathing, brushing, and reducing tangles and/or shedding. A variety of grooming tools will be available for you to try on your dog to see what works best for both of you. There will also be time to ask any questions you may have about home grooming or taking your dog to a professional groomer.

#### INTRO TO CANINE WAGONS & SULKIES (AND DEMO)

If you have been to camp before, you have probably had a moment of envy seeing Jackie R. & Hawk driving down the camp roads via canine wagon. Jackie will introduce campers to the sport of dog "driving" using wagons and sulkies which are smaller and cheaper alternatives to a horse and wagon. This session will cover how Jackie got involved in the sport, what it takes to get your dog "driving" and she will provide helpful resources for buying various carts/wagons/sulkies and harnesses.

#### PINE CONE CEREMONY & LUMINARY WALK

Sunday nigh'ts campfire will be a special one, as we hope to remember all of our years, good times, and amazing memories of Camp Henry Horner. We would like to take a moment to mark this time of transition for Camp Dogwood by giving everyone a chance to share, if they like, a memory, a story of kindness, or just appreciation and gratitude for our time at Horner. As you go through your camp days, take note of the nature around you, be on the look out for a special twig, a leaf, a pine cone, something that speaks to you. Bring this item to the campfire, where you can toss it in the fire, dedicate your item to whatever you wish.



#### SEASONAL CHANGES & ANIMAL ISSUES

Animal behavior is greatly influenced by the weather, season changes and other changes in our environment. Ever wonder why certain things flair up at particular times of the year? Scratching your head as to why your dogs starts coughing or scratching when you think the "allergy season" is over? In this session, we will discuss how the season changes, moon cycles and other "natural shifts" effect our dogs (and us!). Discover how we can actually work in harmony with these shifts to help our canine partners.

#### TEACHING YOUR DOG TO TARGET

Targeting is a "hands off" way of teaching different behaviors for both fun and serious obedience. Targeting is one of the best methods for getting dogs quickly engaged, focused and excited about teaching sessions.

#### TREATMAKING WITH CHEF PATTI

These cooking classe always result in some delicious treats for everyone to enjoy and reciepes to take home and enjoy again and again. Due to the over popularity of this activity there is now a Sign-Up sheet and multiple sessions offered so everyone can enjoy!

#### TRICK TRAINING

Tricks are a great way to keep your dog busy, mentally stimulated and have a lot of fun. You will learn to use various methods of training to teach your dog some fun new tricks including: play dead, bow, weave through your legs, do the moon walk, and push a baby carriage. If your dog already knows some of these you will learn how to teach more complicated versions of each of these tricks. Many are great for therapy dogs or dogs that just like to show off!

#### WEIGHT PULLING & MINI COMPETITION

Weight pull is akin to a human tractor pull. The dogs wear a special padded harness, and are attached to a wheeled cart on an earthen surface, or a sled on snow. The goal is to see how much weight the dog can pull on the cart/sled for a distance of 16 feet. In competition, the handler can have no physical contact with the dog during the pull, and they are not allowed to "bait" the dog at the end of the pull, with anything other than themselves. It is up to the dog's willingness to pull the weight to close the distance between him/herself and their handler! \*The Mini-Competition will be set up like a real pull, and run like a real pull. Campers who have been successful with dogs pulling the cart can participate. Dogs will line up in order, and will pull one at time starting with the lowest weight. The weight will go up in increments and if your dog does not successfully pull, you're "out." Each dog will get 60 seconds to complete the pull, and campers ARE allowed to use treats/bait since this is for fun. Non-participants may watch.

During daily activity periods, YOU decide which of the programs you would like to attend...and then just show up to location listed. A few activities DO require advance sign-up due to limited space and/or additional fees. They are: CGC Test (\$10), Herding (\$30), Nose Work (Level 1, no fee) and Treatmaking with Patti (no fee)

## Only activities listed with a **transfer** require sign-up! ALL SIGN UP SHEETS LOCATED IN DINING HALL.

Private consultations & special offers may also be available at camp through some staff and presenters. To take advantage of these offers, you must sign-up, and pay any associated fee directly to that staff. Sign-up activities include: Human Massage, Photo Sessions, Focused Obedience, Behavior/Agility consults, Grooming consult, and Animal Communication. See the box at the end of this schedule for a list of the available staff doing privates.
